Ordinance 2026-102

Create Chapter 34 Article II Garbage and Refuse Section 34-54 Clean Fill Site Regulations

Permitted materials may be disposed of at the City's designated Clean Fill Site per the following regulations:

- a) Check-in Required. City property owners and residents must stop at the front office of the Public Works Department building before depositing yard waste. City residents must provide their name, address, date, time, and items to be deposited on the check-in sheet.
- b) Clean Fill Site Permit Required. City property owners and residents shall obtain a Clean Fill Site permit from the City Clerk's Office to access the Clean Fill Site.

- (1) Permit. City property owners and residents must provide proof of property ownership or residency to obtain a Clean Fill Site permit. Upon such application, which is on file at the office of the City Clerk, the City of Seymour shall issue to the applicant a clean fill site permit at no fee. The City Clerk's Office shall keep a record of the date of issuance of such permit, to whom issued, and the number thereof. A copy of the application shall be filed with the City Clerk's Office.

- (2) Affixing permit to the owner's vehicle. The permit must be placed on the property's owner's vehicle windshield on the driver side top or lower corner. The permit must remain so affixed until the vehicle is taken out of operation, sold by the owner, or the applicant discontinues property ownership or residency in the City of Seymour.

- (3) Lost Permit. In the case of theft, loss, mutilation or defacing of such permit, a new permit shall be issued by the City Clerk's Office for no fee.

- (4) Transfer of Permit Restricted. No person shall transfer a permit to another person to access the clean fill site. The property owner's permit may be revoked by the City of Seymour for such violation.

- c) Hours of Operation. Permitted materials shall only be disposed of during open hours.

April 1<sup>st</sup> to October 31<sup>st</sup>      7:00 am – 8:00 pm  
November 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup>    7:00 am – 5:00 pm

- d) Permitted. The Clean Fill Site shall only be accessed and utilized by City property owners and residents. The permitted materials must come from a property located within the City.

- 1) Permitted materials for disposal shall include: brush, grass clippings, leaves, garden waste, sod, mulch, dirt, sand, gravel, stumps, stump grindings, concrete, asphalt, and root balls.

- 2) Permitted materials shall be disposed in the posted designated areas in the clean fill site.
  - 3) All materials must be removed from bags and properly discarded by the owner.
  - 4) City property owners and residents are allowed to remove any compost, woodchips, and wood from the drop-off site with prior permission from the Public Works Department.
- 
- e) Prohibited. Non-residents are prohibited from using the clean fill site. Garbage, trash, construction materials, landscaping materials, timbers, plastic edging, rebar, and other hazardous materials are prohibited.
  - f) Commercial contractors. Commercial contractors must seek approval from the Public Works Department before disposing permitted items in the clean fill site.
  - g) Penalty. Any person or entity violating any provision of the clean fill site regulations shall be subject to a citation of \$5 to \$1000.
  - h) Removal of Prohibited Items. If any person fails to remove any prohibited items within the time specified, the Public Works Department shall arrange to have the items removed at the violator's expense. The Public Works Department may send an invoice to the violator for any expenses associated with the removal any prohibited items.
